New Pupil Services Director Students' mobile app brings wealth of experience

Will oversee services for students with special needs

The Hamburg Central School District announces the appointment of Jennifer Barker as Director of Pupil Services. The appointment became effective July 1.

Mrs. Barker had served as Hamburg Middle School Principal for the past nine years. To transition into the new role, she worked with

Interim Pupil Services Director James Maloney, visited in-district special education programs and met with Pupil Services staff. The staff includes special education teachers, school counselors, psychologists, social workers, occupational therapists, physical therapists and speech pathologists.

Superintendent Michael Cornell said that Mrs. Barker stood out among the applicants for the Director's post based on her knowledge, experience and accomplishments in a variety of capacities since joining the district in 1998. That back-

ground has prepared her well for the responsibilities ahead in overseeing resources and services for students with special needs.

"Her proven experience as a leader who is expert, visible and engaged; her commitment to being a true servant leader to the professionals in Pupil Services; and her constant and intense focus on assuring modern learning experiences for all children made it clear that she is the right person to serve as the next leader of the department," Mr. Cornell said.

"We couldn't be more excited to have Mrs. Barker join the Pupil Services Department Team," added Colleen Kaney, Assistant Superintendent of Student Services, Curriculum & Instruction. "Mrs. Barker's knowledge and commitment to the Hamburg Schools and community will allow her to make a smooth transition that will focus on the success of our team and students with special needs."

In her new role, Mrs. Barker will provide leadership in specialized instruction, individualized education program (IEP) development and special education regulations.

"As the leader of Pupil Services, it is my job to ensure that specialized instruction is tailored to meet the specific needs of our unique learners," Mrs. Barker said.

One of her first-year goals is to shape a unified, Grades K-12 special education department and to collaborate with the Pupil Services team to create a learning plan.

Before becoming a Principal in 2010, Mrs. Barker served as Assistant Principal at the Middle School and Union Pleasant Elementary. During her tenure, she was also Director of Camp Hamburg and teacher on special assignment in The Learning Center. She started with the district as an earth science teacher at the High School.

She holds a master's degree in education/administration and supervision from Niagara University, master's in education from SUNY Buffalo, bachelor's in secondary education/earth science from Buffalo State College and bachelor's in environmental studies from SUNY Buffalo.

Boston Valley inclusive playground leaps forward with grant

Hamburg Central's plan to transform its four elementary school playgrounds into areas where children of all physical abilities can enjoy activities together is taking a leap forward with receipt of a \$50,000 matching grant toward revamping the Boston Valley Elementary School outdoor play space.

The grant is from KOMPAN, a Texas-based provider of playground and outdoor sport/fitness solutions.

Boston Valley's current playground was installed in early 2000 and includes a slide, climbing wall and elevated walkways. Some of the playground's original elements have already been removed for safety and what remains shows signs of wear and tear, and lacks variety. Some of the existing equipment will be removed and replaced with new inclusive pieces that motivate play and movement for users of all abilities. Pea gravel will also be replaced with surfacing that is safer and accessible for children with limited mobility.

With a covered picnic area and raised garden beds located nearby, Boston Valley's outdoor recreation space is used by students for activities during school hours and by families outside the school day.

The total cost of the Boston Valley project is estimated at \$235,000. In order to cover the cost of upgrading all of its elementary playgrounds, Hamburg Central has partnered with the Hamburg Alumni Foundation to combine community support with district funding.



School Board member's service on behalf of children recognized

Hamburg School Board member David Yoviene was honored by the Erie County Association of School Boards (ECASB) in June for
