

#### Teacher lauded for dedication to Holocaust awareness

#### Lessons inspire High School students to make a difference

Jim Gang, a social studies teacher at Hamburg High School for 20 years who has made it his life's work to bring the story of the Holocaust to his students, has received the Holocaust Resource Center's (HRC) Toby Ticktin Back Education and Excellence Award.

Named after HRC's founder, the award is presented annually to an outstanding educator who has dedicated a significant amount of time and energy teaching the history and lessons of the Holocaust.

"For Jim, it is not enough simply to have his classes study the event from an academic perspective; but rather, to use this important material to inspire his students to make a difference in their communities, nation and world," said his friend and colleague Andrew Beiter. "Through creating a Holocaust and Genocide Studies elective and Students for Humanity Club a few years ago, he has provided a platform that has reached and inspired hundreds of students, culminating in them doing acts of public service that are remarkable and inspiring."

In addition, Mr. Gang served as a founding member of HRC's New Generation Education Initiative, where he spent three years videotaping and producing classroom-ready films that feature the stories of 12 local Holocaust survivors.

Mr. Gang also attended the Belfer Conference for

Educators and was named a National Teacher Fellow by the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C. He joined a national group of teachers to create online human rights lesson plans for the American Federation of Teachers. Locally, Mr. Gang was a teacher fellow of The Robert H. Jackson Center in Jamestown, named for the U.S. Supreme Court Justice and lead prosecutor of the Nuremberg Trials. Mr. Gang

was an Associate Director of the Academy for Human Rights, where he planned and taught lessons for both students and teachers.

When Mr. Gang's colleague Lori Raybold (2020 recipient of the same award) asked a few students what they loved about their teacher, they said things like:

- "He harbors and cherishes his students' ideas and values the opinions of everyone he encounters."
- "He is an amazing teacher because he is an amazing person, a person who dedicated his life to showing kids they can make a difference."

#### Quilt of Valor wraps Hamburg teacher/veteran in thanks

In a ceremony at the High School in May, she was presented a Quilt of Valor handmade by the Workforce students under the guidance of their teacher Lynn Sajdak and Ruth Shatzel of the Quilt of Valor Foundation. The ceremony expressed gratitude to Maj. Bauer for her service to the nation and was timed to coincide with Memorial Day.

Quilt of Valor is a nationwide endeavor that has presented 271,400 quilts to service members and veterans touched by war since its inception in 2003. In WNY the organization has awarded more than 100 quilts.

Mrs. Sajdak brought the idea to the High School through her connections as a Girl Scout leader as a way to honor a veteran and to provide valuable learning for her students.

"I wanted the students to experience that feeling of giving back

to others, especially those who have served to protect us and our freedoms," Mrs. Sajdak said. "I also wanted them to learn more daily life skills: measuring, following patterns, cutting, sewing on a machine, teamwork, advocating for themselves and working with a supervisor."

Maj. Bauer said she was honored that the students did this for her. She began her military service in 1984 when she entered basic training and clerk typist/admin. specialist military skills training at Ft. Jackson, SC. She advanced through the ranks and at the culmination of her military career had such duties as planning and coordinating field training for a brigade and working with families/soldiers who had orders to go to war. For five years before retiring from the Reserve in 2004, she served concurrently as a teacher at Hambura.

# Summer Principal is "All Paws In!" to help students reconnect to learning

There's little down time in the summer for Armor Elementary teacher Rose Kowalski. For the past two summers, she's served in administrative leadership intern-

ships with Hamburg Schools. As for this summer, she again has a full slate — this time serving as Principal of Hamburg Connects Summer Program PreK-12.

As reflected in that name, the in-person program's goal is for students to reconnect with peers and adults through creative, hands-on experiences that will enhance their academic, social/emotional, and physical well-being. An influx of federal COVID relief funds is making this summer learning

opportunity possible. It has been more than 10 years since the district has been able to offer something similar. The four-week program, open by invitation to elementary and secondary students, will run Mon.-Thurs., July 12-Aug. 5.

Mrs. Kowalski began serving in the new role in May as hiring of staff for the program was in the early stages. She brings experience as an educator for 18 years, serving as a fourth grade teacher at Armor since 2017. She completed a school district leadership internship in Hamburg's Office of Curriculum and Instruction in summer 2019 and school building leadership internship at Boston Valley Elementary in summer 2020.

She holds a master's degree in curriculum and instruction, and bachelor's degree in elementary education, both from Buffalo State College. She also recently completed her certificate of advanced studies in education leadership.
