- We accept mail-in and drop-off payment by check or cash.
 A credit card can be used with online registration ONLY. No phone registrations will be accepted.
- Students of Continuing Education must be at least 21 years old; unless otherwise noted. Registration is required for all classes, even those that are free.
- If you are 60 years of age or older, you are entitled to a senior discount, where noted.
- Classes will not run if Hamburg Central School District's day
 or evening activities are canceled due to inclement weather.
 In the event of such closing, you should attend the next
 scheduled class. In the case of single classes, you will be
 notified of a rescheduled date.
- Once class begins, there are no refunds except for verified medical conditions.

ENTERING OUR SCHOOLS

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINING (FN11)

Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety,depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders. It teaches about recovery and resiliency - the

belief that individuals experiencing these challenges can and do get better.

The course consists of 2 hours of online pre-work(to be completed on your own before the in-person meeting) and 3 hours of in-person instruction. Cost includes a manual.
